**Plainfield East High School**

Plainfield East High School is a four-year comprehensive high school with a current enrollment of 2168. Plainfield East High School is fully accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Illinois State Board of Education.

The school day consists of seven (7) fifty-six (56) minute periods. There are 174 pupil attendance days, two parent teacher conference days, and four teacher institute days on the school calendar.

**Community**

Plainfield Community Consolidated School District 202 serves a sixty-four square mile area in the southwest suburbs, about 40 miles from Chicago, encompassing all or parts of Bolingbrook, Crest Hill, Joliet, Lockport, Naperville, Plainfield, and Romeoville and unincorporated Will and Kendall counties. The District has a mix of rural, small town, and suburban living areas. The District is currently served by an early childhood center, an alternative school, seventeen elementary schools (K-5), seven middle schools (6-8), and four high schools (9-12).

**Grades**

The Grade Point Average (GPA) is computed taking the sum of the quality points times the credit value of the course for earned semester grades and dividing this sum by the cumulative credits attempted. Weighted grades are used in advanced placement (AP) and honors courses.
