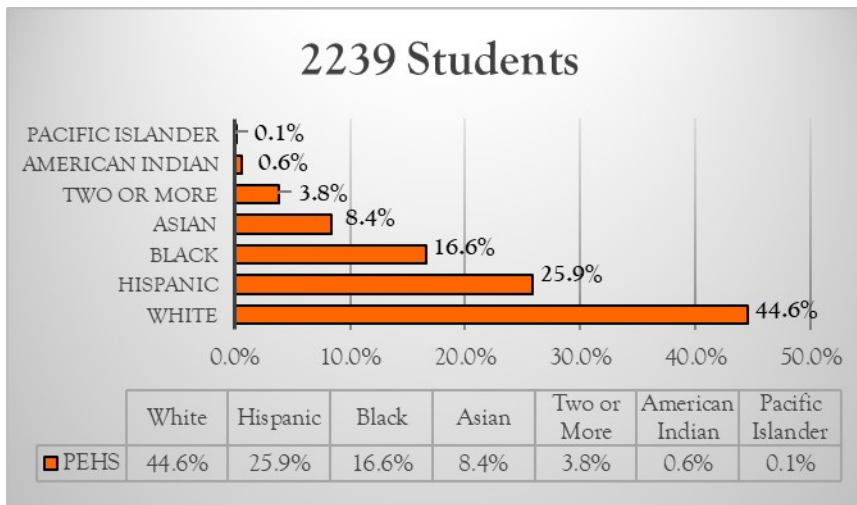


District Community

Plainfield Community Consolidated School District 202 serves a sixty-four square mile area in the southwest suburbs, about 40 miles from Chicago, encompassing all or parts of Bolingbrook, Crest Hill, Joliet, Lockport, Naperville, Plainfield, and Romeoville and unincorporated Will and Kendall counties. The District is currently served by an early childhood center, an alternative school, seventeen elementary schools (K-5), seven middle schools (6-8), and four high schools (9-12).

PEHS is fully accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Illinois State Board of Education. The school day consists of seven (7) fifty-six (56) minute periods. There are 177 student attendance days, one parent teacher conference day, and four teacher institute days on the school calendar. SAT

Starting in 2018, the State of Illinois requires all students to take an SAT assessment in the Spring of their junior year. With an average of 548 students, the average composite score for the past two years is just over 1041.
